Cork City Council Special Meeting to commemorate the first meeting of Council elected by proportional representation

The first of a programme of events in Cork to mark the 1920 centenary, a pivotal year in the city's history and the birth of the nation. At that meeting, the Council pledged its allegiance to Dáil Éireann, a moment of huge national significance.

Over the course of 2020 Cork City will commemorate the death of the city's two martyred Lord Mayors, Terence MacSwiney and Tomas Mac Curtain and the Burning of Cork City. The Burning of Cork by Crown Forces devastated the city in December 1920, destroying more than 40 business premises, 300 residential properties, Cork City Hall and Carnegie Library, hugely impacting the local economy.

This workshop is aimed at Board Members, Directors, Trustees and CEOs/Managers and anyone involved in preparing an Annual Report. An organisation's annual report is a wonderful opportunity to tell their story and engage with their stakeholders (i.e. their beneficiaries, members, volunteers, staff, funders, supporters and regulators). It is a valuable instrument to demonstrate good governance, accountability and transparency.
